from the Rector's Desk

Greetings from your new Interim Rector! My name is David Bateman and I've been on board since September 3rd. I have to say you all have given me a *very* warm welcome.

I specialize exclusively in interim ministry and have been in the Diocese of Central Pennsylvania since 2009. Before coming to St. Andrew's, I served congregations in Camp Hill, Altoona, Bloomsburg and Carlisle. I live in Harrisburg and am newly married as of this summer.

Interim clergy like myself serve in between rectors who are called on a more permanent basis. In the Episcopal church we have learned that after a priest leaves, congregations do better if they take their time doing a self-study and creating a detailed profile of their future hopes and dreams before actually getting into the process of searching for a new rector. So I'll be your "long-term temporary rector" through the time of self-study, self-description, searching and calling. Typically it takes about 18 months or a bit longer.

It's been pretty sudden and maybe even a bit traumatic to have Father Robson leave on such short notice. Of course he did so for health reasons but that doesn't make it any less of a surprise. Being able to say good-bye is important, and so I'm hoping every last parishioner will be here at 7 pm on October 6th to be part of Lynn and David's farewell celebration. And Bishop Audrey will be joining us!

Just like Father Robson I'll be here full-time through the week and will do the full set of Sunday and weekday services and events. If you are able, I hope many of you will stop by during the week and poke your head in so we can get to know one another.

I realize that it's confusing to have one Father David followed by another Father David but somehow we'll manage just fine. I am truly delighted to be here at St. Andrew's and look forward to getting to know each of you better!

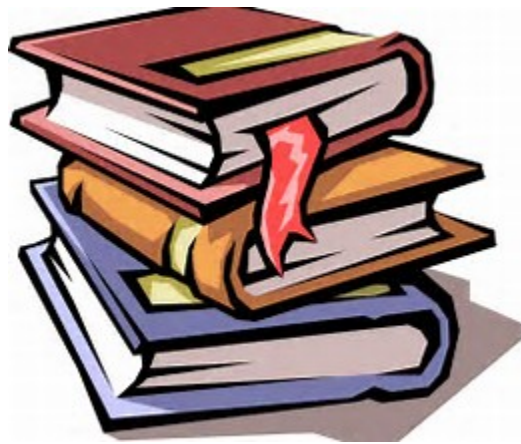

50 Shades of Grace (Fellowship for Women)

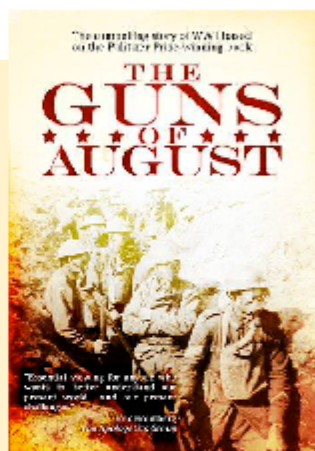
