WATER, WATER EVERYWHERE . . . EVERYWHERE REMEMBER YOUR BAPTISM

"Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?" (BCP 305)

The prayer book sets apart dates throughout the year when it is appropriate to administer the sacrament of baptism (*though these are not the only times the sacrament may be administered*). The prayer book also notes that if there are not candidates for Holy Baptism, then the congregation is to renew the Baptismal Covenant. Thus, our baptismal covenant is essential – it is the core of our Christian identity. We are well served to constantly remind ourselves of what being baptized means and how our baptism shall form our lives.

The above quotation is the final question asked in the Baptismal Covenant. The Baptismal Covenant is presented to us by questions: will you...? We are not told in the covenant "you will . . .". Rather, we are asked "will you...?" Thus, we are allowed to decide for ourselves if we really mean it. It is easy to say "I will, with God's help" in the context of a worship service. It is challenging to live out our response in the world ~ to live it out every day: and it is this living of the covenant that matters most!

Consider the last part: "will you respect the dignity of every human being?" This states clearly what it means ~ respect. the. dignity. of. every. human. being. We aren't asked to respect only

those who respect us. We aren't asked to respect only those that we believe earn or deserve our respect. We aren't asked to respect when it is convenient. By no means! Our respect is to be like the mercy of God given freely and equally to all. Yet, this is so hard. It is not enough for us to just say I will respect the dignity of every human being. We are to live that respect, be that respect, embody that respect.

We will not always live fully into our baptismal promises, but may we always strive to remember those promises and the challenge it is to live out those promises.


Unless we try, we will not grow. And when we grow, we will flourish, and when we flourish the good news of Christ is seen in new and transformative ways, and when the good news of Christ is seen in new and transformative ways by others, the world in which we live changes ~ changes to be more like the love of Christ.

And it all starts, and restarts, with our willingness to respect the dignity of every human being (as well as the other requests of our baptismal covenant). Christ loves and respects you immeasurably; now may you love and respect others immeasurably by the Grace of Christ.

Summer is the season when we often encounter water – swimming, hiking, fishing, travelling. As you encounter water this summer, remember your baptism; remember the love of Christ, remember to live into the love of Christ.

May 17, 2022 Meeting


- Harry Snell continues to coordinate a support group for widowers.






