- F) In the coming months you will be hearing more from your vestry about steps we are taking to "right size" our vestry and set us up to be as effective as possible.
- G) Stewardship: the only way any of the above is possible is by your faithful giving of time, talent and treasure. We need folks to help make all this possible, and we need your financial support to pay the bills, keep our campus up and running, cover salaries and expenses, and most importantly, help us reach forth our hands in love to a hurting world.

Join folks from across our Southern Convocation for a series of "Healing Hikes"



Birthday Church Offering – June & July Our Daily Bread










The Bezalel Crafting Ministry (BCM) meets the 1st, 3rd, and 5th Thursdays of each month between Labor Day and Memorial Day.

Why is this group named this?

First, Bezalel, is a Biblical character, mentioned in the book of Exodus as one whom God called to use his skills in all kinds of crafts for the

service of the tabernacle. See Exodus 31:1-11 and Exodus 35:30-36:2 to learn about his work. We intentionally chose to name our group after a male known for crafting to show this is not the work of one kind of person.

Second, Crafting was chosen as a more inclusive term. This group is not limited to people who only work with yarn or only knit or crochet. Just as Bezalel was skilled in ALL kinds of crafts, this group wants to incorporate all the arts for the glory of God.

Lastly (and most importantly), Ministry is used in our name because we use the skills and gifts of crafts and crafting to share the love of God with others, both within the congregation and out in the community.
