“We shall meet again.”- “Do not be afraid:” words of comfort for our time

On Monday, September 19, 2022, an estimated 4 billion (4,000,000,000) people engaged in some form the funeral service for Queen Elizabeth II. In a span of several hour over ½ of the world's population witnessed the celebration of life of a remarkable public servant, and, more importantly, heard the promise of the Good News of Jesus Christ proclaimed in the midst of the beauty of our Anglican liturgical tradition. During the sermon, Justin Welby, Archbishop of Canterbury, quoted the late Queen's own quotation of a Vera Lynn song “We'll meet again someday”. The Queen included this line in her speech to the nation during the COVID pandemic. The Archbishop echoed these words in the midst of national mourning and grief. Amid this time of mourning these words ring true with the truth of the Gospel. Bursting from the grave on the Third Day, Jesus established the truth of God's love and the nature of Resurrection - we shall meet again. Many needed this reminder - that death is not the end; that God's love is eternal; that all shall indeed be well. Do not be afraid.

Over the last two+ years, there's been a lot of fear in the world. Yet, anchored in the assurance of Christ's love, we press on. We seek to be less afraid as we rely on God's love and the godly love of those around us. Though we cannot totally escape fear, we can certainly seek to make our fear manageable trusting that Jesus Christ is truly with us at all times and in all places. The theme of our Stewardship Program this year is “Do not be afraid”. One of the greatest assets we have to steward is our faith. Our faith in Christ is what helps us navigate the challenges and fears and losses and uncertainties of this life. And we have to steward our faith - seeking to strengthen our faith, deepen our faith, and trust in our faith. As we become less afraid of what may happen and embrace what we are able to make happen, we begin to live

into the truth of the gospel. We are not promised no more days of sorrow or hardship, but we are promised that Christ will be with us throughout all the sorrows and hardships in the days to come and that Christ will raise us up on the last day. As we steward our faith truths such as “We shall meet again” and “Do not be afraid” and “All shall be well” become more than just popular slogans; they become the truths of the faith we have received and seek to pass on. May the Grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, strengthen your faith and guide your steps now and forever.

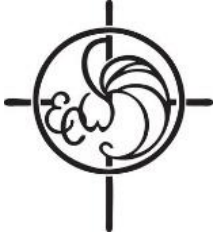
