Like dust under our beds . . . a new day awaits

A mother tells her son to go and clean his room. While not the first desire of his to clean his room, he does not put his whole heart into the task. As a delaying tactic, he finds himself lying on the floor looking under his bed. With ever-widening eyes he jumps us and rushes to find his mom.

"Mom", he exclaims! "Do your remember the story we heard the other day in Sunday School about how God created Adam and Eve? Do you??"

"Yes," mom calmly, and somewhat cautiously responds.

"Do you remember how God took a bunch of dirt and dust and pulled it all together in one place?" he continues.

"Yes," again mom responds with even more caution.

"I just looked under my bed, and I think God's doing it again!"

I've always loved this story since the first time I heard it. For one, it is so relatable, right? Two, it's so encouraging – while God wasn't creating a new race of humans under the boy's bed, the theological conclusion rings true none-the-less: God does work to make all things new! This year February, which is often the case, is a month of significant transition in our spiritual life. February begins by continuing to ride the joyous wave set in motion by Christmas and rolls along in the days and weeks following Epiphany. Then, with a great crash, that wave comes head-on with Ash Wednesday and yields to the great season of Lent.

Lent often makes a bad first impression – due primarily to past experiences people may have had with a tradition that focused more on the "miserable sinner" aspect and less on the "beloved child of God who has been redeemed" aspect of Lent. While we are wise to never lose the penitential aspect of Lent, and the need that we all have of repentance, we are wise to also note the renewing nature of Lent.

Lent extends a hearty invitation to allow God to make in and with us something new. Yes, Lent begins with ashes and the assurance that we all die, yet Easter takes up where Lent leaves us with the assurance that our dust is not left as just dust, but is resurrected into something new (everlasting, eternal) through the love of Christ. And until that great "Getting up morning", we can make ourselves a little less dusty and a little more new (or re-newed) each day as we seek to know Christ more fully in our lives.

I challenge you to make Lent this year an opportunity for some "new-ness" in your lives. Find ways to breath some new life into your Spirituality. Challenge yourself to experience something new in the life of the church. Be willing to step out of your comfort zone in helping others who are in need. Give yourself the great gift of deep self-examination that leads to acknowledge areas in your life that need addressing and then consider that Christ is already addressing those areas and inviting you to change.

"God's doing it again!" Yes, God is – just as God does every day, every year: showing us the great love that God has for each of us, and inviting us to embrace that love and proclaim that love to others.

I invite you to the observance of a Holy Lent . . . (when the time comes). Until then, continue in the joy of remembering Christ's manifestation to all creation.

Vestry Highlights January 17, 2023

- The Vestry said good-bye and thank-you to Alma, Nelson, and Meredith for their time and service to St. Andrew's Church as their 3 year term is now completed.
- There were two actions that required approval. First was the purchase of 2 home communion kits for the Eucharistic Visitor teams and healing oil at the cost of \$500 to be taken from the Memorial Fund. These items were approved. The second action was to approve a maintenance contract for 1 year for service to the Bell. The contract is for \$600. The Vestry approved this action as well.
- The Financial Secretary gave a year end report that we met our budget for 2022. As of 2023 we have 53 pledge units. From these pledges 21 have increased their pledges, 9 new pledge units, and 4 have decreased the rest have remained the same.
- The Treasurer's report also said we met our budget for 2022 and that we only used \$40,000 from the investment account where \$60,00 was budgeted. The new budget will be available at the Annual Meeting.
- The Nominating Committee announced that Frank Youkers and Jennifer Fimiani have both agreed to serve a 3 year term on Vestry. We look forward to their input and service.
- The Jr. Warden (Alma) reported that the Bell is fixed and explained the maintenance contract. She also has received one estimate for a new roof that was broken down into two pieces, one for the sanctuary only and the other for the complete building. This

- issue is still being researched and additional estimates will be reviewed. The finance committee will look into ways including Grant Money to pay for this.
- In his Rector's Report, Fr. Grant highlighted some numbers (that will also be presented at the Annual Meeting) of weekly and yearly attendance at church services. Our average weekly attendance (includes all services) is 146. The average Sunday attendance in person is 81, and the average Virtual weekly attendance is 41. As far as new Membership we have had 4 Baptisms, 7 members who have transferred into the parish and 10 active participants for a total of 21 new members.
- Starting in February, four Standing Ministries will be formally established. They are Property Ministry, Finance Ministry (already in progress), Formation Ministry and Outreach Ministry (combined with other groups who do Outreach) With these established it is our hope that additional parish members will become involved.
- The Annual Meeting is set for one service on Sunday 1/29. Along with the St. Andrew's Award that has been given out the last two years and a second award will be included. This is the "Go & Be" Award given to people or groups that make a difference.

The next Vestry Meeting will be held on February 28th at 7PM. All Vestry minutes can be found on the bulletin board by the Kitchen in the Great Hall.

Bezalel Crafting Group


