We had evidence and no doubt. I had seen birth and death,  
But had thought they were different  
T.S. Eliot - "The Journey of the Magi" (1927)*

One of the great gifts of being part of a "liturgical" tradition is the Church Year. The Church Year is a year marked first and foremost by the events in the life of Jesus followed by the lives of the faithful whose life points, sometimes stoically sometimes compassionately, always gloriously the one's realization of Christ's presence in their lives. The Church Year is rounded out by the lesser occasions, but no less poignant, in our everyday life with God, ourselves, and one another.

If you read the quotation at the beginning of this letter you may be wondering "what is he thinking about a Christmas/Epiphany moment: we are just now putting Pentecost behind us for another year and ready to enter the long, ordered season after Pentecost." Well, I started thinking about the nature of the Church Year, and indeed the nature of life itself, as I was preparing the Wednesday morning services for June. In June we commemorate the Birth of John the Baptizer - the great forerunner of Jesus. Thinking about this from a calendar perspective we know that Christmas is only six months away (*remember, Luke's account of the gospel informs us that John was only six months older than Jesus*).

As I'm writing this we are still in the great season of Easter - the season in which we celebrate Resurrection and the destroying of Death by Jesus. Thus, we have endings and beginnings. When we introduce the Nativity of John we return to beginnings and endings: see a pattern? In June we also commemorate the life of St. Barnabas and the dual witness of St. Peter and St. Paul. Each of these, in their own right, experienced beginnings and endings/endings and

beginnings. When they decided to follow Jesus and his teachings, they each embarked on a new beginning. At the same time, they mourned the ending of things that had been in their lives. Each left behind loved ones and acquaintances. Each left behind their life's plans and goals to follow a radically different set of plans and goals. And each's journey with Jesus was full of beginnings and endings; endings and beginnings.

For me, this month is a powerful reminder of endings and beginnings, beginnings and endings. On June 11, 2011, the Feast of S.t Barnabas, I was ordained to the diaconate ending many aspects of life as I knew it and beginning many wonderful and challenging "new beginnings". St. Paul, an ever-present presence in my spiritual life and growth, features prominently along with St. Peter this month. St. Paul's writings have invited and convicted me in examining my own life in ways I would not have done without having "heard Paul" in 2009: endings and beginnings; beginnings and endings.

As we embark on Summer 2023, please take time to consider what new beginnings you will take - don't keep putting them off. Also consider some endings that may need to come about as well. Remember, in all endings and all beginnings, to anchor them in the incomprehensible comprehensible (yes, *that's corrected*) love of Christ Jesus. Afterall, we don't know him as Alpha (*beginning*) and Omega (*ending*) for no reason.



## Vestry Highlights May 16, 2023

- After several months of discussion, advisement, and review the Finance Committee proposed a recommendation to the vestry on how to invest the recent Estate gifts bequeathed to the parish. Their recommendation is to put the money in the Vanguard account. After a discussion and questions asked the vestry approved and adopted this recommendation. Thank you to the Finance Committee who worked on this.
- The Financial Secretary reported that we are 90% of our budgeted amount for the month and 39% of our annual budget. We are in good shape. (report on file)
- The treasurer reported everything is looking good. A question was asked in reference to the high-water bill we received last month. It was still high again and a slow leak was found in the women's bathroom which was fixed. (report on file)
- Committee Reports: ECW highlights that Eileen and Kathleen will be attending the ECW Province III annual meeting in July at the Roslyn Conference Center in Richmond. Also, that there was discussion again regarding the kitchen counters and sink replacement. Alma and Jr. Warden John are working on this, but nothing will take place until the Fall.
- The Communication Committee will host a ministry fair again this year on 9/10. The Community Fun Day is being moved to October 8<sup>th</sup> and an ice cream social will take place on 7/2.
- The Education and Formation Ministry are working on events for both children and adults this fall. They are also putting together a prayer guide to use in both small and large group gatherings.
- Jr. Warden reports that the dishwasher has been fixed in the kitchen. Also, the stove had burners replaced due to the smell of gas leaking. The toilet in the woman's bathroom that had a slow leak was also repaired. This was the cause of the high-water bill over the last few months. New blinds were placed in the choir room. Lastly, an electrician will come in June to check the lights in the church.
- Rector's Report

- June will begin the first Sunday evening services at Sam Lewis Park at 5PM.
- Ascension Day service will gather at Sam Lewis Park at 6 PM on Thursday 5/18.
- Hikes will continue at Gettysburg on Sunday afternoons this year. Dates to be determined.
- Martha's ordination date is Saturday 7/8. Transportation will be arranged at the church by either carpool or bus depending on how many will attend. A BBQ celebration will be on Sunday 7/9...details are still being worked out.
- The stain glass window store that Fr. Grant had been in contact with regarding Memorial Windows for Roger Stabley and Luther Wise has gone out of business and the owner of that store has recently passed away. Other stores will be looked into to start this process again.
- Our recent graduates will be recognized in June.
- Last month Jenn suggested making a flyer highlighting our parish to distribute to local establishments such as the Literacy Center, nursing homes, etc. Barb designed such a flyer and presented a rough draft. Some additional ideas were suggested, and Barb will add these to the flyer.

The next vestry meeting is scheduled for June 20<sup>th</sup> at 7PM in the Great Hall.


